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He graduated the University of Tokyo, Faculty of Science in 1956.

After he granted the Ph.D. from the Graduate School of University of Tokyo in 1961, he commenced research as a Research Associate at Kanazawa University, School of Medicine and at Kyushu University School of Medicine.



From 1964 to 1967, he was a research fellow at the Biological Laboratories, Harvard University. From 1967 to 1968, he was a Research Fellow at Department of Biochemistry, Stanford University Medical School. He was appointed Associate Professor in Department of Biochemistry, Kyushu University in 1968, and in 1975 Professor in Laboratory of Molecular Genetics, Osaka University.

In 1975, after attending the Asilomar Conference, he became a Fellow at Department of Biophysics, Princeton University. He was a Professor in Institute of Molecular and Cellular Biology, Osaka University in 1982, and Director of the Institute from 1987 to 1997.

Since 1997, he was a Professor at Nara Advanced Institute of Science and Technology and Vice Director at International Institute of Advanced Studies.

Through 1991 to 1994, he served as a Vice President of Human Genome Organisation (HUGO). He now is President at DNA Chip Research Inc, since April 1998.
